"Texas school boards are so important because they bring a deep understanding of the needs and aspirations of their local communities to their role," Troxell said. "Boards lead their districts by providing oversight, setting goals, overseeing the budget, and selecting and evaluating the superintendent. These volunteers serve for the betterment of their communities.'

The Texas Association of School Boards states the main function of a school board is to provide local, citizen governance and oversight of education. Though ultimate responsibility for education rests with the state, Texas has delegated much of the authority to local communities who elect their local school trustees to govern the school district.

The idea behind this structure of shared responsibility is that, while some education policy issues are best addressed

Here are some answers to commonly asked questions about local school boards in Texas and how they function.

#### Q: Who Is Responsible for Public Education in Texas?

A: The commissioner of education, the State Board of Education (SBOE), and the Texas Education Agency (TEA) guide and monitor public education in Texas. The SBOE provides leadership and state-level administration as prescribed by law, and the commissioner and TEA staff implement state

education policy. Within the framework of state and federal law, your school district has significant latitude in shaping the educational programs of your schools.

#### Q: Why Do We Need

Local School Boards? A: The US Supreme Court has said education is perhaps the most important function of state and local governments. Our system of local school districts and boards of education epitomizes representative and participatory government - citizens elected from their community making decisions about educational programs based on community needs, values, and expectations. School boards are entrusted by the public to translate the needs of students into policies, plans, and goals that will be supported by the community.

#### Q: What Do School Boards Do?

A: Local school board responsibilities can be grouped into five catego-

- · Adopt goals and priorities and monitor success
- Adopt policies and review for effectiveness.
- Hire and evaluate the superintendent.
- · Adopt a budget and set a tax rate.
- · Communicate with the community.

#### Q: How Do School Boards Make Decisions?

A: A school board is a local governmental body that can only act by a majority vote at a legally called public meeting. Each individual board member's primary responneeds and resources, and, after due consideration, vote in the best interest of the students and the district at such a meeting.

#### Q: Who Can Participate in a School Board Meeting?

A: Citizens are welcome at all school board meetings, except in a few legally specified circumstances permitting closed meetings. School boards allow public participation and have policies communicating how and when people can share their input. Generally, boards set aside a portion of their meetings for public comment and limit each speaker's comments to a certain time, for example, one to three minutes. This is a chance for people to give input while allowing adequate time for other important board business.

#### Q: When Are School Board Members Elected?

A: Traditionally in the state of Texas, School board elections are held on the first Saturday in May or first Tuesday after




#### Jerry Brice Borchardt

#### How are your investments taxed?

As we begin the new year, you may be receiving various tax statements from your financial services provider — so it's a good time to consider how your investments are taxed. This type of knowledge is useful when you're doing your taxes, and, perhaps just as important, knowing the type of taxes you generate can help you evaluate your overall investment strategy.

To understand the tax issues associated with investing, it's important to understand that investments typically generate either capital gains or ordinary income. This distinction is meaningful because different tax rates may apply, and taxes may be due at different times.

So, when do you pay either capital gains taxes or ordinary income taxes on your investments?

You receive capital gains, and pay taxes on these gains, when you sell an investment that's increased in value since you purchased it. Long-term capital gains (on investments held more than a year) are taxed at 0%, 15% and 20%, depending on your income. Also, qualified dividends - which represent most of the dividends paid by American companies to investors are taxed at the same rates as long-term capital gains. (Keep in mind that you'll be taxed on dividends even if you automatically reinvest them.)

On the other hand, you pay ordinary income taxes on capital gains resulting from sales of appreciated assets you've held for one year or less. You also pay ordinary

#### Message from the CITY **MANAGER**



Dear Sanger Residents and Businesses,

Happy New Year! I trust this message finds you well and that you had a joyful holiday season surrounded by friends and family. As we welcome the beginning of 2024, I want to extend my warmest wishes to each and every one of you for a year filled with happiness, success, and

Now, I'd like to share some important updates and changes that will shape our community in the coming months, starting this January.

Trash and Recycling Services Transition: Beginning this month, the City of Sanger will be transitioning its trash and recycling services to Republic Services. In an effort to minimize road damage, we are moving to a once-a-week pickup schedule for garbage, yard waste, and bulk waste. If you need additional waste or recycling cans, you can request them for a fee through our website or by contacting customer service. Keep an eye out for Republic Service containers replacing your Waste Connections trash cans. Waste Connections will continue servicing those with Republic Service containers until the transition is complete.

135 Project and Water/Sewer Plans: Our Public Service department is making great progress, with the I35 project plans in motion and the water and sewer plans at 95% completion. Starting in early January, the Water Department will begin installing new water meters for all residents. These meters will provide more accurate measurements of water consumption, and the project is expected to take 6-8 weeks. With the new water meters, you'll have access to a Customer Portal to monitor your daily water usage. The portal is expected to go live by the end of the first quarter. Look out for more information on this in your mail, on Facebook, and on our website.

Additionally, we're addressing House Bill 3 by installing generators for all water sites. The first of five new generators is already being installed, and all wells will have backup generators by the end of March.

Sanger Public Library Programs: The Sanger Public Library has some exciting programming lined up for January, including pottery classes on the 19th and 26th, as well as a mini quilting class on Saturday, January 13th. Space is limited, so be sure to check with the library for more information or to sign up.

United Way Tax Assistance Program: The United Way will once again be offering its free tax assistance program starting Saturday, January 26th, and continuing through tax season. Please note that it's on a first-come, firstserved basis, and you must meet income levels to qualify. No appointments are being taken.

I want to take a moment to express my sincere gratitude to each of you for your contributions to our community. Your involvement is what makes Sanger the wonderful place it is. Wishing you all a joyful and prosperous January! Stay connected through our website and social media for more updates.



The City of Sanger has implemented a public records portal utilizing Laserfiche. This Public





Presented by American Legion Post 268



He has gone to 2 certification classes in preparation of us receiving our new truck in 2024. He has also showed a great attitude around the station. He has helped train some our new guys in fire and EMS. Daniel has done everything that has been asked of him. Daniel has shown great compassion to our citizens, and treated everyone he encountered with the up most respect. This is why we have chosen Daniel Wisian to receive our Firefighter of the Year award for

Sanger Police Chief Tyson Cheek presented Lieutent Justin Lewis as the Officer of the Year for 2023. "I asked members of the department who they would select as Officer of the Year for the Sanger Police Department. The person garnering the most comment and praise was Lt. Justin Lewis.

the first Monday in November. Special elections to fill the unexpired term in the event of a board vacancy must also be held on a uniform election date.

Q: How Are School Board Members Elected?

A: School district trustees are elected by popular vote. Whether an election is by majority or plurality vote is a matter of local policy. Traditionally, trustees serve either three- or four-year terms, and most trustees serve staggered terms to support board continuity.

Q: How Does the School Board Work with the District Superintendent?

A: The operation of the school district at the local level is also a shared activity. The role of the school board members and the role of the superintendent are different:

Your school board governs the district, but it does so with the advice of the superintendent.

The superintendent manages the district, but they must do so with the oversight and management of the board, and within the framework of policies and priorities your board adopts.


