Early Voting for the Tuesday, March 3 Primary ends at 7 p.m. on Friday, February 27th. There are 55 locations in Denton County, you can early vote, including in Sanger at the Community Center at 101 Freeze Drive. But, on election day, you can only vote at your local precinct location, listed above from 7 a.m. - 7 p.m. Go to www.votedenton.gov for a complete list of early voting locations in Denton County.

There are nearly 10 pages of ballots total for republicans and democrats to vote on their respective candidates, including several propositions for each party.

You will be voting on Governor, Senator, Congress, Attorney General, Lieut. Governor, Comptroller of Public Records, Railroad Commissioner, Commission of Agriculture, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, and that is just on the first page of each ballot.

Texas voters to weigh 10 propositions on the ballot in March 2026 Republican Primary

Texas GOP voters will weigh in on 10 non-binding propositions during the March 3 primary to signal party priorities for the 2027 legislative session.

The ballot measures cover high-profile issues, including phasing out property taxes, ending Democratic committee chairmanships, and banning "Sharia Law."

While these votes won't immediately change state law, the results will be used to shape the official Texas Republican platform at the party's June convention.

GOP propositions on March 2026 ballot

Big picture view:

Although the propositions will not change state law, they are intended to gauge Republican primary voters' support for key issues and help shape the party's legislative agenda. The results are expected to influence priorities debated at the Texas

Voters to weigh 13 policy propositions in March 2026 Democratic Primary

Texas Democrats will vote on 13 non-binding advisory propositions during the March 3 primary to help shape the party's future legislative platform.

Key issues on the ballot include Medicaid expansion, public school funding increases, cannabis legalization and the implementation of "red flag" gun safety laws.

While these propositions are non-binding, party leaders use the results to gauge the priorities of the Democratic electorate and shape the party's legislative platform for the coming year.

The 2026 Democratic Propositions

The following propositions will appear on the Democratic ballot:

Proposition 1: Medicaid Expansion Calls for Texas to expand Medicaid to ensure access to affordable healthcare for all residents. Supporters argue that current state leadership has blocked federal funds that would help bridge healthcare gaps.


Local firefighter with Brush Truck help battle 8-Ball Fire that burned over 13,000 acres in Panhandle

Two big fires near Amarillo burned out of control last week and over the weekend. The Sanger Fire Department sent Madison Pearse who is on Brush 671 earlier this week in the Texas Panhandle. He was on the 8-ball fire near Amarillo that burned 13,500 acres. Firefighters from dozens of North Texas departments were deployed to battle the fires. The 8 Ball and Lavender wildfires, which burned a combined 32,000 acres across the Texas Panhandle, have been declared 100% contained. Currently, Pearse is still out there helping battle smaller fires.

In the past two weeks, Texas A&M Forest Service and TIFMAS personnel have responded to nearly 50 fires. You can view the Texas A&M Forest Service active wildfire map at: public.tfwildfires.com. 

Cecil "Cy" Nathaniel Campbell III

March 31, 1965 - February 14, 2026

Cecil "Cy" Nathaniel Campbell III, 60, of Denton, Texas, passed away February 14, 2026, after a courageous battle with prostate cancer that began in 2023 and transformed to small cell carcinoma in late 2025. He faced his illness with faith and courage, often using the phrase #GodsGotThis as he walked the journey hand in hand with his wife. Together they overcame many obstacles before the battle became too difficult.



Born March 31, 1965, in Bluefield, West Virginia, Cecil was the son of the late Nancy and Cecil Campbell. Born into a family where his father served as a Baptist pastor, his faith was deeply rooted; he accepted Christ at the age of 10 and often lived by the conviction that "with God, all things are possible." His grandfather nicknamed him "Cy" after the great Cy Young — a name he insisted on from childhood, sometimes to the point of being counted absent in school when teachers called for "Cecil."

Cy graduated from the University of Tennessee with a degree in criminal justice and served in the United States Navy. He worked for many years as an investigator in law enforcement before moving to Texas. Since 2003 he was a familiar presence at Sanger ISD sporting events, serving as the clock operator for junior high and high school football and basketball games.

An avid sports fan, Cy enjoyed reading, metal detecting, hunting, and fishing. Whether tracking down a relic with his metal detector, casting a line at Lake Ray Roberts, or sharing a story after a hunt, he savored simple moments. His hobbies reflected a curious, patient spirit and a deep love of quiet, honest pursuits. He was deeply proud of the students of Sanger, applauding each accomplishment. He supported his wife, Karen, unconditionally in all her endeavors as an educator; they were married for 23 wonderful years and were inseparable—where one was found, the other was often close by. Many who knew them described their love as unique, heartfelt, timeless, and lasting.

He is survived by his wife, Karen Campbell, of Denton; his sister, Diamond, of Sevierville, Tennessee; and many nieces, nephews, and friends who were touched by his friendship and love. He was preceded in death by his parents, Nancy and Cecil Campbell, and by an infant son.

A memorial service will be held at Sanger First Baptist Church on February 28, 2026, at 10:00 a.m., followed by interment at Hope Cemetery in Henrietta, Texas.

The weekly painting lessons they enjoyed together created lasting bonds, cherished and remembered by Jody with great love. Sadly, Doug, Claudia, and Rip passed before Melva. The loss of her children were her very saddest moments.

Melva's most treasured qualities were her passion for life and her attention to detail in her personal appearance. A lover of shopping for clothes, wigs, and makeup, she embodied confidence and grace, often humorously acknowledging, "I know," when complimented on her figure even at 100! In times of confusion, she maintained a desire to be well-kept, showing her inherent dignity and spirited nature.

Her interests were varied and enriched her life;

Unlock the full potential of your 401(k)

Your 401(k) is one of the most powerful tools for securing your financial future. The question is: Are you using it to its full potential?

Here are some strategies to help you maximize its benefits:

Earn your employer's match. It's a good idea to contribute as much as you can afford to your 401(k) plan. (In 2026, you can put in up to \$24,500, or \$32,500 if you're 50 or older. If your plan allows, there's also a "super catch-up" contribution of \$11,250 for people aged 60 to 63, for a total contribution limit of \$35,750.) At least put in enough to earn a matching contribution if one is offered. Otherwise, you're shortchanging yourself. For example: Your employer matches 50% of your contribution up to \$5,000. If put in

\$8,000, your employer's 50% match is \$4,000, and you're leaving \$1,000 "on the table."

Give your plan a raise. When your income increases, consider increasing contributions to your 401(k). When you get a bonus or a tax refund, you could use some or all of that to boost your retirement savings.

Evaluate the Roth option. When you invest in a traditional 401(k), you contribute pre-tax dollars, lowering your taxable income that year. Your earnings grow tax-deferred and are taxed when you withdraw. If your employer offers a Roth 401(k), you contribute after-tax dollars, so your taxable income doesn't drop that year. However, withdrawals in retirement, contributions and earnings alike, are generally tax-free. (Employer matching contributions and related earnings remain taxable.) If you expect a higher tax bracket in retirement or want to diversify tax treatment for flexibility in retirement, consider the Roth option. In 2026, the Roth option must be used for catch-up contributions if you earn more than \$150,000 and you are 50 or older. Consult your tax advisor before

deciding.

Build an appropriate investment mix. You may have multiple investment options in your 401(k). The driving principle early on is growth so your plan can fund a long retirement. But growth-oriented investments are naturally riskier than fixed-income vehicles. When starting your career, you may prefer a portfolio weighted toward aggressive growth, as you have years to recover from downturns. Nearing retirement, though, consider shifting to a more conservative mix. A financial advisor can help you choose an appropriate mix at different stages, based on your risk tolerance, time horizon and goals.

Keep your plan intact. At times, you may feel a financial pinch that leads you to consider taking out loans or early withdrawals from your 401(k). However, this can cause you to incur taxes and penalties and will likely slow the growth needed to help reach your retirement savings goals. Taking steps to prepare for unexpected expenses, such as building an emergency fund containing three to six months' worth of living expenses, can help you avoid dipping into your 401(k). You may also be

able to find other ways to access cash.

By following these steps, you can unlock the full potential of your 401(k) and position it as a

cornerstone of your retirement income.

Timothy Morton received the Law Enforcement Officer of the Year Award

Officer Timothy Morton recently received the 2025 Law Enforcement Officer of the Year award, presented by the Sanger American Legion Post 268 at a Sanger City Council Meeting. Officer Morton was nominated by his peers for this award and selected in December.

Officer Morton's nomination and selection stemmed from his lifesaving actions during a welfare check on an interstate overpass in late December 2024 for a person sitting on the overpass railing. When Officer Morton arrived on scene, the person immediately turned and swung a leg over the side as if to jump into traffic below. He struggled with the larger and stronger person on the edge of the overpass for a full minute before getting them onto the bridge deck, where he wrestled with them for another three minutes before two passersby stopped to help, and a second officer arrived to assist. The person was taken into protective custody and transported to the hospital.

The actions of Officer Morton undoubtedly saved the life of the victim, who was intent on ending their life that day.

GOP convention in June 2026 and guide lawmakers during the 2027 legislative session.

Republican primary voters will be asked to vote "yes" or "no" on each of the following propositions.

Property tax and government spending
 Proposition 1: Texas property taxes should be assessed at the purchase price and phased out

entirely over the next six years through spending reductions.

Proposition 2: Texas should require any local government budget that raises property taxes to be approved by voters at a November general election.

Health care and vaccination status
 Proposition 3: Texas should prohibit denial of healthcare or any medical service based solely on the patient's vaccination status.

Education and social issues
 Proposition 4: Texas should require its public schools to teach

that life begins at fertilization.

Proposition 5: Texas should ban gender, sexuality, and reproductive clinics and services in K-12 schools.

Term limits and legislative leadership
 Proposition 6: Texas should enact term limits on all elected officials.

Texas water export
 Proposition 7: Texas should ban the large-scale export, or sale, of our groundwater and surface water to any single private or public entity.

Immigration
 Proposition 8: The Texas Legislature should reduce the burden of illegal immigration on taxpayers by ending public services for illegal immigrants.

Texas Legislature leadership
 Proposition 9: The Republican-controlled Texas Legislature should stop awarding leadership positions, including committee and subcommittee chairmanships and vice chairmanships, to Democrats.

Religion and Law
 Proposition 10: Texas should prohibit Sharia Law.

What's next:
 Once again, since these measures are non-binding, their outcome won't trigger any instant policy shifts. Rather, they act as a litmus test for the priorities of Republican primary voters.

Propositions
(Continued from pg. 1)

Proposition 2: Immigration Reform Advocates for "humane and dignified" immigration policies and clear pathways to citizenship, emphasizing the positive contributions of immigrants to the state.

Proposition 3: Reproductive Rights and Healthcare Decisions States that Texans should have the right to make their own healthcare decisions, specifically including reproductive rights, and urges the removal of insurance barriers to treatment.

Proposition 4: Housing Affordability Addresses the housing crisis in both urban and rural communities, suggesting the state use funding and regulation to improve access to affordable homes.

Proposition 5: Public School Funding Proposes funding Texas public schools at a per-pupil rate equal to the national average. Proponents note that Texas currently ranks 42nd

in the nation for student funding.

Proposition 6: Online Voter Registration Calls for secure online voter registration for all eligible residents, a system already used by 42 other states.

Proposition 7: Environmental Protection Advocates for stricter enforcement of environmental standards to protect air, water, and biodiversity, citing a decline in air and water quality over the last 40 years.

Proposition 8: Cannabis Legalization Supports legalizing cannabis for adults and the automatic expungement of criminal records for past low-level, non-violent cannabis offenses.

Proposition 9: Wage Increases and Cost-of-Living Adjustments Proposes raising salaries to the national average and providing biennial cost-of-living increases for school and state employees based on the Consumer Price Index.

Proposition 10: Redistricting Reform Calls for a ban on racially motivated

and mid-decade redistricting, suggesting the creation of a non-partisan board to redraw district lines every 10 years.

Proposition 11: Fair Taxation Advocates for shifting more of the federal tax burden onto the wealthiest individuals while providing income tax relief for the working class.

Proposition 12: Public Transportation Supports the expansion of accessible public transportation in both rural and urban areas to help residents reach workplaces, schools, and medical facilities.

Proposition 13: Gun Safety and "Red Flag" Laws Calls for "red flag" laws (Extreme Risk Protection Orders) to prevent individuals with a history of domestic abuse from purchasing firearms. Supporters point to data showing that the presence of a gun in domestic abuse situations significantly increases the risk of homicide.

Twister Wilson, Reed Sebastian, Travis Martinez, Maddox VanderRoest, Michael McKeown, and Kyle Goss each collected two hits.


