


SISD considering three plans for the upcoming school year

Texas leaders expect public schools to re-open for in-person classes in August, but appear willing to leave many of the health and safety decisions for combating the ongoing coronavirus outbreak to local education officials, including whether to require students and faculty to wear face masks.

Texas Education Commissioner Mike Morath was expected to release formal safety guidelines Tuesday regarding the opening of public schools in the upcoming 2020-21 academic year, but backed off in the face of rising COVID-19 cases across the state.

A draft of the state guidelines, however, briefly was posted to the TEA's website.

In it, TEA officials recommend — but do not require — that local school leaders implement several health and safety protocols to fight the spread of the coronavirus. They include placing desks at least six feet apart, requiring students and staff to wear face masks, taking the temperature of teachers and other staff members at the start of each day and setting aside times for hand washing, among

The guidance does outline several mandates: people with confirmed or suspected cases of COVID-19 must remain home while sick and meet three conditions before returning to school; school leaders must notify local health officials

and school community members of individuals who were on-campus and tested positive; educators must provide instruction on hygiene practices on the first day of school.

"While it is not possible to eliminate all risk of furthering the spread of COVID-19, the current science suggests there are many steps schools can take to reduce the risk to students, teachers, staff and their families significantly," the draft states.

In a conference call Tuesday afternoon, when he laid out plans for how schools will receive funding, Morath said the preliminary health guidelines "are still draft, working documents."

"It's a rapidly changing public health situation, so we are unable to give final guidance (Tuesday) on on-campus instruction," Morath said.

The agency did confirm that school funding will be based on student attendance, which will include students on campus as well as those who choose to stick with the kind of online instruction and distance learning that districts provided after Gov. Greg Abbott shut down all public schools in March

Local school leaders across Texas are awaiting directives from the state as they craft extensive plans for the upcoming school year. They are deciding how to structure school days, implement safety protocols, assign staff responsibilities and provide instruction to students who fell behind in recent

SISD is coming up with three plans this week to consider: A) Opening the school with no restrictions; B) Brick and Click - Some students will be in class and some will do

remote learning; C) Click Only or Remote Learning Only. SISD is expected to implement one of the plans and will have an announcement in the coming weeks. School is scheduled to start on August 12. SISD Superintendent Dr. Tommy Hunter said last week he doesn't anticipate the drafted school calendar (dates) to change, with any of the plans listed above. SEE 2020-21 SISD CALENDAR ON

At the same time, education and public health officials worry about the potential for increasing the spread of the nov-While coronavirus. children fall ill from COVID-19 at exceedingly low rates, health experts fear they could infect staff members or relatives.

Texas State Teachers Association President Noel Candelaria said state leaders should issue a mask mandate for all people on campus. The Texas Classroom Teachers Association argued the TEA "must provide clear, enforceable parameters" for reopening schools that are set by state health care professionals.



Denton County Commissioners Court launched the second phase of a small business grant program at noon on Monday, June 22, 2020, through noon on Monday, July 6, 2020, to provide up to \$50,000 grants to Denton County businesses who have been negatively financially impacted during the COVID-19 pandemic.

"The Denton County Commissioners Court continues to be committed to helping our local businesses recover from the financial losses suffered during the COVID-19 pandemic," said Denton County Judge Andy Eads.

"As we have said earlier, this Phase II continues our efforts to help in the recovery of our local economy," he said.

In Phase II of Denton County OPEN, for profit businesses headquartered and located in Denton County with 100 or fewer employees (excluding ineligible entities listed below) are eligible to apply.

The amount a business can receive will be based on the documented negative financial impact of COVID-19 between March 1, 2020 and June 20, 2020.

\$20 million The identified for the Denton County OPEN grant is a portion of the stimulus money Denton County received from the US Department of Treasury under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (the "CARES Act"). Denton County is re-investing these funds into the Denton County OPEN program to benefit Denton County businesses impacted by COVID-19.

"Our Chambers of Commerce and Economic Development Corporations across Denton

Denton County OPEN offers \$20 million in grants for businesses

County will again help to promote this program and answer questions, regardless of whether businesses are members or not," Judge Eads said. "We appreciate their willingness to help us get the word out on this second phase of Denton County OPEN."

Michael Talley, Director of Economic Development for Denton County, worked with the Commissioners Court to implement a Chapter 381 Economic Development Agreement to allow the county to administer and develop a program to make grants of public money stimulate, encourage and develop commercial activity in the county.

The COVID-19 pandemic hit all of our business community hard, especially, our small businesses," Michael Talley said. "This second phase

County commissioners decline to mandate wearing masks

presented to Denton commissioners on Tuesday — the COVID-19 health crisis is worsening, but commissioners declined to vote on mandating citizens to wear masks.

For several months, Denton County Public Health director Matt Richardson has provided the Denton County Commissioners Court with updates about the ongoing coronavirus health response. On Tuesday, Richardson noted that countywide cases continued to spike, but stopped

A stark update was short of calling for a face mask requirement for businesses or the public.

> Richard-Instead. son said that face masks would only be recommended, citing that hospital capacity "remains very flexible."

"We have a high margin to accept a potential surge, but if that changes, public health does reserve the right to recommend to the court that we have communitywide interventions," Richardson said. 'We are monitoring that in our surveys and conversations with hospital administrators are telling

us that hospital infrastructure [remains] intact and that it's not taxed."

Though the county's weekly positivity rate increased Monday from 7.8% to 9.3%, Denton County Judge Andy Eads remained steadfast that no face mask requirement is coming.

Eads has received significant flak from the public and other elected officials, with dozens of Tuesday's public comments urging for a more proactive response to the health crisis. Eads received numerous public comments, he said, call-

ing on commissioners to take up action similar to Dallas County, but noted that the two counties have large differences.

"Dallas County has three times the population, eight times the number of cases and eight-and-a-half times the number of deaths, so when people say we need to be 'more like Dallas County,' I think a lot of our measures in Denton County work," Eads said. "We continue to do mobile testing across the county [and] we relaxed criteria so that we can test

In addition to the weekly positivity rate increasing, Richardson said both symptom onset and daily cases reported are trending upward in the last few weeks. With expanded testing standards, Richardson noted there was no ascertainment bias.

"We have expanded who can get testing, so we would anticipate that we would have more individuals who are the 'worried well,' but even when we included them, we're still seeing an increase in the percent positive, which is concerning," he said.

The most prominent spike the county health department is seeing is of individuals between the ages of 20-29, who are the leading age group of community infection. While this is concerning because of possible transmission to older and more vulnerable populations, Richardson said patients in that age group aren't needing hospitalization.

According to daily hospital capacities, slightly over half of all hospital beds were occupied, while roughly 43% of ICU beds





SHS and SMS workouts canceled for two weeks because of COVID-19

Last week, a parent of a student-athlete received a positive test result for COVID-19. However, this athlete has participated in summer conditioning on Sanger ISD athletic facilities and was in attendance June 17. For privacy reasons, SISD cannot communicate what groups this student participated in or the name of the student and their family. Because this student participated in strength and conditioning, inside the weight room, and inside the gyms any athlete who participated in these activities was potentially exposed despite the cleaning efforts.

In response to this test result, Sanger ISD took the recommended precautions of the Texas Education Agency and the local health authorities.

All athletic summer training is canceled for the next two weeks. All Sanger ISD athletic facilities, including fields, tennis courts, tracks, are closed to the public during this time as well. Coaches will have the ability to resume their sessions on July 6, 2020.

Beginning July 6, Sanger ISD will have the following precautions implemented:

- · An electrostatic sanitation sprayer that uses a heavy-duty, quaternary cleaner, disinfectant, and sanitizer that remains on surfaces for 7-10 days will be sprayed on every surface in the facility daily.
- · Athletes and coaches are to observe social distancing protocols whenever possible.
- Coaches and trainers will sanitize equipment in between athlete rotations.

· Hand sanitizer dispensers are available inside of the weight room, in addition to at the

entrance for locker rooms, coach's offices, training rooms, and weight rooms.

- · Students' temperatures will be taken before entering the workout session daily.
- In addition, students will only be allowed to enter the session if:
 - They have no symptoms
- They have received a negative COVID-19 test result if they've been tested.
- · If a student has been tested and not received their result, they may not attend the session.
- · If a student develops symptoms, we encourage them to be tested for COVID-19.

We encourage you to vigilantly monitor for signs and symptoms of illness, and should such symptoms be present we strongly encourage you to get tested. If such symptoms are present when we resume, please refrain from attending. We also ask that you keep the coaching staff informed of any test that is done and its subsequent results.

These summer workouts and training sessions are completely voluntary, and no athlete will receive consequences of any kind should they choose not to participate," according to the SISD letter that was posted on the website.

UIL directors are 'absolutely dedicated' to having fall sports season and hope to announce plans 'soon'

During the UIL's biannual legislative council meeting last week deputy director Jamey Harrison said the organization is "absolutely dedicated" to holding fall high school sports seasons amid the coronavirus pandemic.

Of the 27 public proposals the athletics committee evaluated during a virtual video conference, seven focused on coronavirus-related action.

The UIL had already implementing some suggestions, including the permission for schools to open their athletic facilities and the return of summer strength and conditioning programs, which also allows for skill-specific coaching.

Other proposals requested the UIL allow only family members to attend games in the fall and suspend all sports for the 2020-21 school year due to the pandemic.

Committee members were vague in their evaluation of the proposals.

A few cited the UIL's adherence to Texas Gov. Greg Abbott's statewide permissions. Executive director Charles Breithaupt referenced "a great plan" for "getting back to normal in the fall," but he did not elaborate.

"We are in very close contact with our state leaders, continually working on plans," Harrison said. "The situation is very fluid and circumstances and information changes, so we have to pivot regularly on our plans.

"I promise everybody on this call and everybody listening: We are absolutely dedicated, as Dr. Breithaupt mentioned, to having seasons this year and getting plans out to schools in time to plan for those activities in an appropriate way just as soon as we

"I'm hoping that we will have news on that relatively soon, so stay tuned. We're going to continue plugging away and getting these things ready to go."

The organization has allowed schools to resume summer strength and skill workouts since June 8. But several independent school districts and other individual schools have already suspended their sessions after student-athletes tested positive for





beds and approximately 14% of ventilators were in use, according to data from DCPH. Of that, 28 beds are occupied by confirmed COVID-19 pa-

"This is good news," Richardson said about current hospital capacities in addition to the mortality rate. "COVID-19 has not greatly impacted our mortality rate and, that could change, but the county is below the state, national and global average."

As commissioners resort to encouraging rather than requiring, Eads said the reason behind their decision was an attempt to balance individual freedoms with personal responsibility. While commissioners ended Tuesday's meeting without indication of a forthcoming mask ordinance, he said businesses and municipalities can require face masks be worn, too.

As the health response continues, Eads said that outbreaks and resurgent cases were expected, as a vaccine is not available.

"What we are looking at is data regarding hospitalizations, as the herd immunity is spreading across the county, we do not have a vaccine, but herd immunity is being formed across the county, which is expected," Eads said. "Just because [Gov. Greg Abbott] has opened up Texas does not mean that the coast is clear — it's more than masks, it's a lifestyle change."


