

Bob always had the philosophy that if you took care of your customers and your employees, they would take care of you...and they did. All five of Bob and Kay's children worked along-side of them starting in high school until the business was sold in 2003. > Bob served on GCISD School Board from 1974 1980, serving as Vice President during his second term. While serving on the GCISD school board, Bob was a leader in developing the co-op program for the school district. He employed hundreds of high school students, in each of the stores, working with their schedules so they could still participate in extracurricular activities at school. In addition, Bob was an ardent supporter of children with special needs and employed them in each of his stores. In addition to employing students, Burrus Supermarket made large donations to organizations in each school district surrounding the stores, which included, but are not limited to, the High School Yearbook, FFA, Band, and the athletic programs, in each

school district. Bob received the Friend of Education Award, and he was appointed to the GCISD Walk of

Bob worked hard to grow and expand his business. In doing so he served on various boards as well as receiving awards in the grocery industry. He became President of North Central Texas Food Industry Assn., he was appointed to the Affiliated Foods Store Board of Directors twice, where he served as treasurer, President, and then Chairman of the Board. He served a three-year term with the Texas Retail Grocers Association. Bob left Affiliated Foods and joined Fleming Wholesale Grocers becoming President of IGA Stores served by Fleming in Texas. In 1998, Burrus Supermarkets celebrated its 50th year in business, and in 2000 was selected as 1 of 6 International Retailers of the Year. In 2003, he sold the stores and he and Kay retired.

In addition to his career in the grocery business, Bob served his community and the school district with conviction and integrity. He was a member of the Grapevine Rotary Club where he served as treasurer and President and was a recipient of the Paul Harris Fellow Award and Rotarian of the Year. He was appointed as the first President of the Airport Cities Chamber of Commerce, a member of the Grapevine Citizens Advisory Committee, and the American Bank of Commerce Advisory Board.

Bob started the Grapevine Banner with Mike Story and Ken Lynch; he was a recipient of the Colleyville Business of the Year. He was major contributor of several orphanages. He strongly supported GRACE in Grapevine. Bob received the Grapevine Chamber of Commerce's D. E Box Citizen of the Year. Additionally, the Baylor Board of Directors in Dallas appointed Bob to be a Trustee on the Board of Directors of the Baylor Grapevine Medical Center. He served nine years and was recipient of the Keeper of the Flame Award. He was a donor of a new wing at Baylor Hospital Grapevine, now known as Baylor Scott and White Medical Center of Grapevine. In 1996, he and Kay moved to Alvarado, and were members of the Alvarado Church of Christ where Bob served as a deacon. Sanger's 2023 football season didn't go quite the way it hoped.

The Indians entered the year having earned three consecutive playoff berths and had made the postseason in eight of their previous 10 seasons overall. The departure of a sizable senior class full of key contributors along with a change in coaching staff, however, presented significant challenges.

Those difficulties all amounted to a tough 2-8 season that the program is eager to put in the past.

Sanger has plenty of returning experience to spearhead those efforts with nearly all of last year's starters back this fall. That core is tied for the most returning starters of any 4A defense in the state and also tied for the second-most returners of any 4A offense, according to Dave Campbell's Texas Football.

It's a group that has been fueled all offseason by a desire to prove the doubters wrong with a resurgent 2024 campaign.

Sanger returns several key contributors on both sides of the ball. RB/LB Luke Thompson, LB Ty Wellman, QB Reed Sebastian, DL Soren Bertelsen, WR Dylan Brown and ATH/DB Jaise Jackson headline the Indians. They were all pre-season top players in the area by the Denton Record-Chronicle.

SHS varsity football returns 20 starters

Luke Thompson is expected to see time both ways this fall, but mainly made his mark on offense last season as the Indians' most consistent source of production. He put up 854 yards and seven touchdowns on the ground alongside 235 receiving yards for two more scores to earn second team all-district honors, all marks he aims to improve on this fall.

Wellman and Thompson are just two key players among a uniquely deep group of returners who are hoping to help Sanger take a step forward this fall. Wellman is one of the Indians' top returners in a largely unchanged defensive core that's aiming for an improved 2024 campaign after some challenges last fall. The senior is Sanger's top returning tackler after anchoring the linebacker position and is one of 10 defensive starters back to play in 2024. Wellman posted 82 tackles (50 solo), six tackles for loss, two sacks, three fumble recoveries, two forced fumbles and one pass breakup a season ago.

Bertlesen earned the final spot in the top five (DRC - top players). The senior is one of the Indians' top returners defensively after putting up 31 tackles (16 solo), 12 tackles for loss and two hurries last year.

Jaise Jackson is among a plethora of key returners. The junior made some significant contributions last year in tallying 35 tackles (28 solo), nine pass breakups and one fumble recovery to help anchor the Indians' defense, and should remain an important part of the unit.

The offense brings back several other cornerstones at the skill positions in junior quarterback Reed Sebastian, junior running back Reggie Jones, senior wide receiver Dylan Brown and junior wide receiver Joel Rodriguez. The lone key loss within the offensive skill group is wide receiver Easton Elsey, who signed to play college football at Southeastern Oklahoma

Sebastian threw for more than 1,700 yards last season with 13 touchdowns and 13 interceptions, numbers he'll look to improve on this fall as the offense aims to take a step forward.

A few underclassmen already made their impacts felt last season and could be key difference-makers for the Indians.

Sophomore wide receiver/defensive back Austin Martin emerged as one of the team's top defensive players with 61 tackles (42 solo), three tackles for loss, two interceptions and two forced

cial presentation since Coach Ivy's son Keith is the head football coach at Aubrey High School. "It just made sense to honor James Ivy," said Rodgers







fumbles last year as a freshman. Fellow sophomore wide receiver/ defensive back Wyatt Pennington carved out an early role, too, with 27 tackles (20 solo), two tackles for loss and two pass breakups.

That pair and others are among the younger players who could help Sanger take a step forward this fall, both through

their own production and by pushing the players in front of them.

"Our young kids are so athletic," Sanger head football coach Chad Rogers said. "We've got some freshmen and some sophomores that can play. No-

body should be like, 'Oh, I've got this sewed up.' The skill kids especially. You've got to come out and practice."


